Blacks and Soldiers in the Colony of Sierra Leone, at present
 employed in the service by Government in cutting a road
 in their place of settlement; have 2 rows of land each
 line with their wives in a temporary settlement in the neighbourhood
 of their employment; are distinguished from
 the Patriots by being more loyal, orderly and respectful, as
 were the best wages in the Colony (G. P. Parker Esq. for
 the Captains).
