Disposal

Persons and children in the Colony of Sierra Leone, at present
 employed in the service of Government in various ways
 to their (place) of settlement, have 2 years of land each
 two with their wives in a temporary settlement in the midst
 of their employment, are distinguishable from
 the persons by being more busy, active and respectful, so
 ever the lowest wages in the Colony (See per day 1/2d per
 Man Capence).
