Disposal

Persons and children in the Colony of Sierra Leone, at present  
 employed in the service by Government in various ways  
 to their (place) of settlement; have 2 acres of land each  
 two with their wives in a temporary settlement in the midst  
 of the forest of their employment; are distinguishable from  
 the Africans by being more busy, active and respectful, so  
 ever the lowest wages in the Colony (See per day 1/2d per  
 Man per day)
